New Hampshire State Convention: The 116th annual State Convention of the New Hampshire Knights of Columbus is being held again this year at the Radisson Hotel in Nashua. The convention begins on Friday, May 1st with registration and Mass at 6:30 celebrated by Bishop Peter Libasci. There is a Saturday morning "Commemorative Service Mass" at 11: 00 am. The Saturday evening banquet is the social event of the convention. Additional brothers are urged to attend this event. Dress code is white dinner jacket, 4th Degree tuxedo or suit & tie. Men are required to attend the business sessions and there is a ladies program for the ladies while the men are in session. The convention closes Sunday morning with Mass at 8:00 am. Annual Election of Council Officers: Nominations for office will take place at the May 13th monthly meeting at St. Lawrence with elections following at the June 10th meeting at St. Raphael. The offices of the Council are: Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Chancellor, Recorder, Treasurer, Advocate, Warden, Inside Guard, Outside Guard and three trustees with a three year trustee being elected each year. Convention delegates and alternates are also elected at this time also.
