For the K of C...

Fr. Jerome Joseph Day, O.S.B., pastor of Saint Raphael Parish, suggests that K of C members might find two recent books worthwhile. For an inspiring and exciting non-fiction account from World War II, Laura Hillenbrand's *Unbroken* tells the story of Louis Zamperini, a juvenile delinquent turned athlete turned airman. His struggle against disaster in the air, the vastness of the Pacific and the dangers of Japanese prison camps provides a riveting account of physical endurance, moral courage and determined will. This book, published in 2010 by Random House, is the real thing - and now a major Hollywood film. See the movie? Sure, if you can. But read the book? Absolutely!

For a more spiritual work, I never miss an opportunity to recommend The Lord, a series of essays on the identity and mission of Jesus Christ. With Lent beginning Feb. 18, this classic work by Msgr. Romano Guardini, a 20th century German priest who confronted Nazi ideology and survived, offers the reader a rich array of insights into the life and times of the man from Nazareth. The Lord takes account of the best in biblical scholarship, the Fathers of the Church, various traditions of spirituality in the Church over the centuries and the insights of modern psychology - but remains rooted in the gospels. The Lord, and Guardini generally, contributed to the thinking of three popes, John Paul II, now a saint, Benedict XVI and Francis. The Lord opens up a treasury of insights into who Christ is and what he means in our lives in an accessible and engaging fashion. Reissued by Gateway Editions in 1996.
